Summary:

Ordinance 2025-006, enacted by the City of Newberry, Florida, amends the city's regulations concerning abandoned vehicles to enhance clarity and enforcement procedures.

Key Points of the Ordinance:

- Definition of Abandoned Vehicles: The ordinance provides a clear definition of what constitutes an abandoned vehicle within city limits, aligning with existing provisions in Chapter 94 of the Newberry Code of Ordinances.
- Enforcement Procedures: The amendment outlines the procedures for identifying, reporting, and removing abandoned vehicles, ensuring a streamlined process for city officials and residents.

• Public Awareness: By addressing abandoned vehicles, the ordinance aims to maintain public safety and the aesthetic appeal of the community, reflecting the city's commitment to quality of life and property values.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NEWBERRY, FLORIDA, REPEALING AND REPLACING CHAPTER 94, ARTICLE V, ABANDONED VEHICLES, SECTION 94-121 – 94-125 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES CITY OF NEWBERRY, FLORIDA. PROVIDING FOR DEFINITIONS, PROHIBITIONS, IMPOUNDMENT APPLICABILITY OF THE ORDINANCE, LAYING OUT THE PROCESS FOR ABANDONED VEHICLES WITHIN THE CITY OF NEWBERRY, PROVIDING FOR **ORDINANCES** IN SEVERABILITY, REPEALING **ALL** CONFLICT, CODIFICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
